Dear Friends,

I am writing to express my gratitude for your generous gift to Samaritan's Purse to help with our earthquake relief efforts in Haiti. I was there just a few days ago and can tell you firsthand that the needs are still overwhelming.

We are continuing to provide food, clean water, medical care, and temporary shelter to as many people as possible. Also we are continuing to send supplies, including flying in badly needed vaccines. We have been able to help over 70 orphanages with food, blankets, and other urgently needed items. Samaritan's Purse has more than 80 staff and volunteers currently on the ground working under some of the most difficult circumstances I have seen. Please remember them in your prayers.

While I was there I met with pastors and church leaders who shared powerful testimonies about God's protection during this catastrophe. Although the physical needs are tremendous, they are also concerned about the great spiritual needs around them. Many churches believe that God will use this in a mighty way to open up Haiti to the Gospel.

The people in this devastated region will need help for a long time to come. We want to be there to help them recover and rebuild in the Name of Jesus Christ. Thank you for your support and prayers that make our work possible. God bless you.
