

Woodland Presbyterian School Dress Code
Little Woodland, Pre-Kindergarten, and Junior Kindergarten

Woodland's dress code philosophy is intended to reflect the school's mission and values as a Christian educational community by providing a standard that creates a positive disciplined environment. A dress code policy allows students and staff to concentrate on instruction rather than peer pressure and competition which may cause distractions in learning. Woodland administration has the final determination of dress code compliance and reserves the right to modify the dress code. Failure to comply may require the parent to provide a change of clothes.

Guidelines	Students in Little Woodland (2K), pre-kindergarten, and junior kindergarten are to dress within the broad guidelines of a neat and clean appearance in clothing and shoes that are appropriate for school and play. Please label everything with your child's name. You will need to provide a change of clothes for your child that will be kept at school. Please include underwear and socks. These clothes will remain at school in a large zip lock bag provided by the school
Required Items	Students in grades pre-kindergarten and junior kindergarten are required to purchase the cobalt-colored polo shirt from Lands' End to wear for designated school-sponsored events.
Shoes	Athletic or closed-toe shoes with socks are required for early childhood students for safety reasons. Athletic shoes must be worn on P.E. days. Shoes with wheels or lights are not allowed.
Hair Accessories Miscellaneous	All jewelry and headbands must be conservative. Multiple necklaces and bracelets are prohibited. Extreme types of haircuts and/or hair color are not allowed. Hair color must not deviate beyond the normal hair color range.
Non-Uniform Days	During the school year, certain days are designated as Spirit Days and other non-uniform days. The dress code for Spirit Days includes clothing from the Woodland Spirit Shop and other shirts that have Woodland written on them (athletic team shirts, school-sponsored clubs, etc.)
